

## From Jubilation to Desolation

The adoring crowds, chanting "Hosanna to the Son of David" (Matthew 21:9), capture our attention on this Palm Sunday. We hear the crowds, and we rejoice with them. Sometimes, we forget that not everyone in the crowd is joyful. Some are challenged; some are threatened. For them, Jesus is not Good News; he is not the long-awaited one—he is something entirely different, and he must be silenced.

Our Sunday celebration begins with jubilant crowds and ends with a most cruel death. Those who were once joyful are now silent and dispersed. It appears that the authorities have once again triumphed. Hope is dashed. The promise remains unfulfilled.

Spiritually sit with desolation in the week that comes. Do not jump ahead to the triumphant end of the story. It is true that we are an Easter people, but we must also pay attention to the details of how evil often attempts to silence the good. It is important, as people of faith, to remind ourselves that even when all things seem to be lost, the Father has the last word. His will is accomplished. He is the Creator and the author of the story. We should always prepare ourselves to be surprised. To embrace light instead of darkness. And, even when there is death all around us, to know that there will be life—life in abundance for all. ●

#### FAST AND ABSTINENCE

As Catholics we are obliged to join the Church around the world in the only two days of fast and abstinence—**Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.**

For Catholics aged 14 years and older, every Friday in Lent is a day of abstinence from meat.

From the age of 14 until the age of 60 all Catholics are obliged by the law of fasting, which is eating two small meals and one regular meal, with no food in between meals.

## YOU ARE INVITED!

### THE EASTER TRIDUUM (TRI-doo-um)

The Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday begins the three days of the Easter Triduum, actually one celebration over those three days.

1. **Holy Thursday** one sees a re-enactment of Jesus' example of service and humility by washing the feet of His disciples. Following communion there is a procession with the Eucharist to the tabernacle for Adoration until 10 pm.
2. **Good Friday** we begin with Stations of the Cross at 2:30 pm followed by a Service proclaiming the Passion of the Lord and veneration of the Cross. There is a brief communion service and Vigil of the Cross until 8 pm.  
At 8 pm there will be **Tenebrae**, an ancient candle-lit service of the Passion as seen through Mother Mary's eyes. Candles light the church and are extinguished one by one as the service progresses.
3. **The Easter Vigil** begins at 8:30 pm on Saturday with the **Service of Light**, lighting of the new fire and Easter candle; **Liturgy of the Word**; **Liturgy of Baptism** and renewal of Baptismal promises, Confirmation; and **Liturgy of the Eucharist**.  
A reception follows Mass, and Easter breads will be blessed.

## PRO-LIFE NEWS

A retired Vancouver family physician (Dr. Regglar) who is an active MAiD provider, explained how he resolves his moral unease in reflecting his discomfort with Track 2 MAiD cases (those who are not in imminent threat of death). He stated, "Once you accept that life is not sacred and not something that can only be taken by God—a being I don't believe in—then, ... some of us have to go forward and say, 'We'll do it.'"

Track 2 MAiD now includes persons whose sole underlying condition is disability, chronic illness and even mental suffering. The safeguards keep loosening. The language keeps softening.


