Close Enough!

It is the fourth Sunday of Advent. When Christmas is this close, one takes that final leap. Isaiah is centuries from Christmas, but he cannot wait! He sees the "sign" as clear as day: "the young woman, pregnant and about to bear a son" (Isaiah 7:14). And how about that Son! None other than "Emmanuel" himself—God-With-Us! Paul, too, is bursting at the seams! Inspired by what he calls "the obedience of faith" (Romans 5), he is excited to see the gospel thriving even among the Gentiles. For him, the "Spirit of holiness" is a gift offered to all—Christmas every day, you might say.

Speaking of "obedience of faith," Joseph is the perfect example. The word "obey" comes from the same root as "to hear," and Joseph has almost supernatural ears! Matthew, the former tax collector, tells "how the birth of Jesus Christ came about" in today's gospel reading like a bookkeeper—the Holy Spirit in Column A, Joseph in Column B, with Mary in the middle. But when an angel whispers to Joseph at night, his dream comes true: "he took his wife into his home." Everything is set for Emmanuel!

So, the Bible is brimming with Christmas, that is, "God-With-Us," from end to end. And when a virgin can conceive, are any of us exempt from "birthing" Jesus in our midst? Even when a "happy holiday" seems impossible in the midst of war or violence or poverty, when our ears hear only silence, let's sing Christmas carols every day! ●

A Win for Slovenia

Slovenia passed a euthanasia law in July 2025. In response a citizens' group organized a signature campaign and collected 46,000 signatures, enabling them to challenge the euthanasia law through a referendum. The 53% to 47% victory overturns the euthanasia law and once again protects Slovenians from being euthanized.

The euthanasia bill proposed in Slovenia was very similar to Canada's euthanasia law.

“We saw his star at its rising and have come to do him homage” (Matthew 2:2) describes the spark that sent the Magi on their journey. Something unusual in the sky, interpreted as a sign of something wonderful—in response, they changed direction in their lives and devoted themselves to a completely different path. As wonderful as it might well be, a special star in the heavens is not the ordinary experience of how we learn to follow the Lord or discern his will. If only there could be a sign in God’s universe for each of us, beckoning us forward, clarifying what we need to do, setting down the path that needs to be followed. Perhaps life would be much simpler. Or perhaps not?

Would it truly be less complicated if everything were made clear and certain? Is the manifestation of God’s grace and blessings confined to the straight and narrow, or can we also experience God in the chaos—“in the weeds,” so to speak. Human experience seems to suggest that life is more “gray” than “black and white.” There is real grace in the journey, in making mistakes, even in choosing something that is incomplete. Thankfully, God’s grace does not need perfection to be powerful. We can know and follow God’s will for us in the ordinary moments of day-to-day living. We do not need the extraordinary or the dramatic. ●

CWL NEWS

The reason for the season is nearly upon us and the New Year right behind. We want to thank all members of the Holy Cross CWL for the work and support they have provided throughout 2025.

Our CWL currently consists of 48 members for a total of 1,530 years of service. The main service we provide at Holy Cross is that of funeral receptions for our parishioners and being sacristans.

We regularly support Catholic organizations in Regina with donations, such as Carmichael Outreach, Chili 4 Children, Rooted Connections (formerly Catholic Family Services), Christmas Cheer Fund (women & children's shelters), St. Maria Faustina School for their Christmas hamper program, Campion College Scholarship Fund, Visitation House, Santa Maria, the Marian Centre, Regina Pro-Life and Euthanasia Coalition, our own Parish as required, plus requests from other needy organizations.

In addition, we sponsor a child with Chalice; offer a scholarship for post secondary education for children of Holy Cross parishioners, provide a donation to our Holy Cross Golf Tournament. Not to forget our muffin program where we supply Sacred Heart, an inner-city school, with breakfast muffins each month.

Our fundraising consists of events such as the Christmas Bake Sale, cabbage roll making, the trade shows, the Poor Man's Supper, and proceeds from donations for funeral receptions. This year to date we have given a total of \$5,380 for worthy causes.

We just have to give you some fun statistics here. Cabbage roll making is one type of fundraising we do and took place three times this year—Easter, Harvest Supper, Christmas Bake Sale. Not one got past the pre-order stage; they were all sold out before the event. We made a total of 3,922! cabbage rolls and brought in \$3,280. People like those cabbage rolls!

We had nine funerals at Holy Cross this year and served a reception for eight of them.

Other events we participate in are the Poor Man's Supper and a Stations of the Cross leader during Lent, and while it isn't on our CWL list of things on which we take leadership, many of our members have husbands who belong to the Knights of Columbus. Of course, we are the assistants and support our men there, too.

We have to thank the many parishioners who are not CWL members but who regularly help us out with baking muffins and making cabbage rolls.

From all Holy Cross CWL members to all Holy Cross parishioners, Fr. Carlos, Deacon Martin, Rita and Jacob, we wish you a very Merry Christmas and a happy, holy New Year.

Note: There will be no meeting in January. **But bring your muffins during the first week of January.** The next meeting: Tuesday, Feb. 3. Muffins wanted then too. .

Embracing a Spirituality of Listening

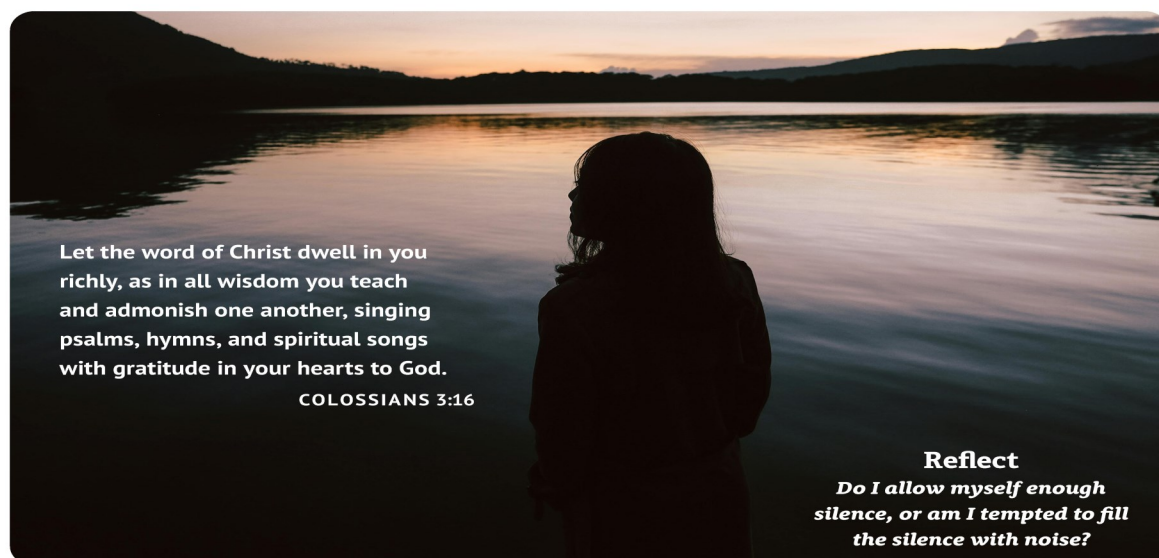

The most treasured prayer of Jesus' people has long been and remains the Shema: "Hear O Israel, the Lord is God. The Lord is One." Jewish spirituality is grounded not in seeing or touching or tasting, but in hearing. No one exemplifies fidelity to this way of being in the world more than Joseph, as evidenced in today's gospel. Joseph is one who listens to what God's messenger says to him and immediately acts on it. He responds to the call to flee with Mary and Jesus to Egypt. Then, he responds to the call to return home with his family to Israel. As many have noted, Joseph never speaks in Scripture, but he certainly listens, and he certainly acts on what he hears.

Christmas is perhaps the noisiest season of the year. At gatherings of family and friends with festive music in the background, it often feels as if we are shouting over one another to be heard. It is a season when it can be hard to have deep conversations, even with God. Indeed, it can be such a busy season that sometimes our regular prayer practices fall by the wayside. But, if we do not make space in our daily lives to listen, might we miss messages that are important, even urgent, for us to hear, as in the case of today's gospel? Messages that require immediate response? What would it look like to carve out a bit of silence in this holiday season, to be like Joseph and regroup yourself in a spirituality of listening? ●
