Isaiah 49:3,5-6 / 1 Corinthians 1:1-3 / John 1:29-34

## Behold the Lamb of God!

**O**f the many names Scripture provides to help us ponder the mystery of Jesus, one of the most intriguing is the name that John the Baptist offers at the opening of today's gospel: "Behold the Lamb of God!" (John 1:29).

Scripture scholars debate what John means here. Is he alluding to the Passover lamb—that unblemished lamb whose blood the enslaved Israelites were to post over their doorways? The angel of death knew to "pass over" these homes. Perhaps John was saying that by Jesus' blood, the people would be freed from death.

Or was John thinking about the guilt offerings mentioned in the Hebrew Scriptures when priests offered animal sacrifices to God as a way of seeking the removal of their sins? Leviticus mentions use of a scapegoat who would carry the sins of the people away into the desert. (See Leviticus 20-28.) Could John have understood that Jesus would bear the sins of the world?

Or did John have in mind the great constellation Aries, the ram, considered the prince of the stars of the sky, the center from whom all the other constellations were mapped in ancient times? Perhaps John was pointing out that Jesus was the center around whom heaven and earth revolve, like the ruling lamb mentioned in the Book of Revelation.

Today at Mass, when the host is elevated and you hear John's words again—"Behold the Lamb of God!"—take a moment to savor these words anew. ●

### PRO-LIFE NEWS

*This article is a year old this month but nothing has changed in practice. (ed.)*

Throughout 2024, the mainstream press woke up to a brutal reality: Despite decades of sinister fearmongering about “over population”, the world is experiencing a critical shortage of babies that will threaten our way of life in every way imaginable.

### ARCHANGELS

There are three Archangels, the only angels called by name in the Bible—Michael, Raphael and Gabriel. Their feast day is Sept. 29.

The first, **Michael**, whose name means “Who is Like God?” is known as a defender of faith, protector of souls, and a symbol of divine justice.

In the Old Testament he is seen aiding the prophet Daniel (Daniel 10:13).

St. Michael is called upon during times of physical or spiritual danger, for **protection against evil** in all things and is considered a great defender of Christ's Church on Earth. His most notable battle is described in the Book of Revelation, where he defeats Satan and casts the fallen angels out of Heaven. He is the patron of many, including first responders, soldiers, and those needing special protection.

The second archangel is **Raphael**, his name meaning “**Divine Healer**”. He is found in the Old Testament Book of Tobit. Because of his role in Tobias' life, Saint Raphael is invoked by those seeking spiritual or physical healing. His intercession is also sought after by singles discerning the vocation of marriage.

St. Raphael is the patron saint of travelers, healthcare workers, blindness, matchmaking, and the sick.

The third archangel is **Gabriel**, meaning “**Strength of God**”. In the Old Testament Book of Daniel, he interprets Daniel's visions for him.

He is best known for his role in the **Annunciation** (Luke 1:26-38). He also told Zechariah of his

## PRO-LIFE NEWS

### THE FEDERAL REPORT: A NEW YEAR, A NEW RESOLVE

The following is an excerpt from a report which came about from a discussion which took place after a late night Mass on Christmas Eve with a Deacon, a church organist, and a pro-lifer.

In our country, the law permits, perhaps encourages, Medical Assistance in Dying (MAiD), which, under the guise of 'compassion,' 'concern for dignity' and 'respect for choice,' is euthanasia by needle-administered poison.

As the law stands now, MAiD for mental illness alone will become legal in March 2027 unless Parliament intervenes. Private member's Bill C-218, first read in parliament in June 2025, would stop the scheduled expansion of Medical Assistance in Dying (MAiD) to people whose sole underlying condition is a mental illness.

As I reflect on the state of the country at the end of the year, I wonder what the year ahead holds for Canadians.

Will we rise to defend the vulnerable, or will we drift further into the still cruelty of death by committee? Will our lawmakers rediscover the courage to restrain the state, or will they continue to expand its reach into the consciences of our families, our churches, and our communities? The year ahead will try the national soul. And yet, at this dark moment in the darkest time of the year, we find our hope in those we love and in a child born in a stable, in the bleak midwinter of long ago.

Now I return at the end of the discussions with the Deacon and the church organist at the boardroom table. They depart, one after another, into the still and holy night of Christmas Eve.

I remain in the office to tidy and reflect. ... As we walk into our new year, each of us severally and together, it holds endless possibilities.

Many things may yet be and many things may yet pass away without taking hold.

As pro-lifers, we must cooperate with Truth itself to bring about a just and prosperous country, protecting the innocent and vulnerable, and filled with the silence, cries, and laughter of children, the young, the old, all beloved.

As for my part, I, with many others, answer the call on behalf of all pro-lifers to bear witness to our lawmakers in the House of Commons and at their various committees that the Moral Law on our hearts is binding, the Common Law demands justice, and the Truth, born to us this day, has come to set us free.

I call on you to enjoin yourselves to me in spirit and sacrifice.

Know that your praying and your giving make possible my witness on your behalf.

Are you with me?

Let us walk into the new year together, hand in hand with Truth and Justice.

### GREEN RIBBON SUNDAY

January 28, 1988 is the date when the Supreme Court of Canada struck down the abortion law in what is known as the Morgentaler Decision. [It appears this decision was based on an IF.] If a woman had an abortion for medical reasons but had been unable to contact a therapeutic abortion committee for an approval certificate in a timely manner, she could be subject to criminal charges. The approval certificate was necessary as a valid defense of the criminal charge. This lack of timely availability for some made the law uneven in its application and was therefore struck down. Nowhere did it say that unequal access to abortion itself was unconstitutional.

Charter 7, right to "security of the person" reads as follows: "Everyone has the right to life, liberty and security of the person and the right not to be deprived thereof except in accordance with the principles of fundamental justice."

[Actually], the Court was unanimous in finding that the state had a legitimate interest in the protection of the fetus. As to whether the fetus is included in the word "everyone" in the Charter and thus has an independent right to "life, liberty and security of the person", all of the majority judgments noted that the Court had not been asked to decide that question. It remains an open question. Parliament needs to draft a new law.



### ORDINARY TIME (continued)

After Eastertide the Ordinary Time resumes on the Monday after the Solemnity of **Pentecost (May 24th in 2026)**. Besides the times of year that have their own distinctive character, there remain in the yearly cycle thirty-three or thirty-four weeks in which no particular aspect of the mystery of Christ is celebrated, but rather the mystery of Christ itself is honoured in its fullness, especially on Sundays.

Ordinary Time, originating from the Latin: *Tempus per annum*, is the part of the liturgical year in the liturgy of the Roman Rite, as revised in 1969. The word "ordinary" as used here comes from the ordinal numerals by which the weeks are identified or counted, from the 1st week of Ordinary Time in January to the 34th week that begins toward the end of November.
