## Open Door

MIGUEL DULICK

It is "Good Shepherd Sunday," and the gospel quotes Jesus: "I am the gate for the sheep." It seems the oddest of Jesus' "I am" identities, until you realize that the shepherd himself was often the literal gate of the sheep's pen, as he would lay his own body across the entrance to keep the sheep secure and safe from any predators. Actually, the predators that worry Jesus the most are other shepherds—"strangers" who came before him, all of whom Jesus flatly denounces as "thieves and robbers."

Does that scare us today? Are we vulnerable to attacks, even from those supposedly in charge of our care? When Jesus opens the gate, we go in and out through him, through Jesus, to find pasture. We follow

him because we recognize "his voice." In the synodal Church that Pope Francis called us to, and to which we continue to be called by Pope Leo XIV, every voice is welcome and needed so that the Holy Spirit will fill the whole Church with truth.

Here in Honduras, where I live, folks with little education can offer profound witness to the love of God. It comes from their own intimacy with Jesus, recognizing his voice in their daily life. They are often the poor victims of widespread corruption, like "a thief [who] comes only to steal and slaughter and destroy." Here in Honduras, we take refuge in Jesus, that we "might have life and have it more abundantly" (John 10:10). ●

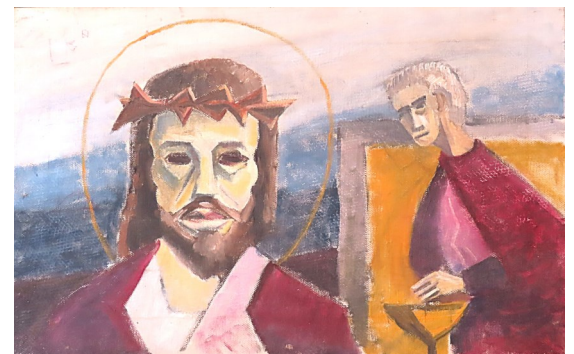
Jesus is Condemned

Les Cloutier, son of S. Paul Cloutier, brought in two paintings this week he is cleaning out his father's house now that his stepmother has moved. Paul was the man who was commissioned to make our Stations of the Cross and donated them to Holy Cross in 1961.

Les believes these were character study pieces his father did in preparation for making our Stations of the Cross mosaics (the 1<sup>st</sup> one, Jesus is Condemned).

Cloutier painted primarily in acrylic and watercolour and drew inspiration from the fields, skies, and structures of the Saskatchewan landscape. One ambitious project involved painting the grain elevators along highway 11 between Regina and Saskatoon, an endeavor that spanned about 15 years. Cloutier also worked in portraits and was commissioned to paint the official portraits of Saskatchewan's then-premier Ross Thatcher and Lieutenant-Governor R.L. Hanbidge (1969). Over his years of work, Cloutier also provided 106 portraits for the Saskatchewan Sports Hall of Fame and the Saskatchewan Press Club (1971-1992).

Paul passed away in Moose Jaw, on September 4, 2013 at the age of 94.

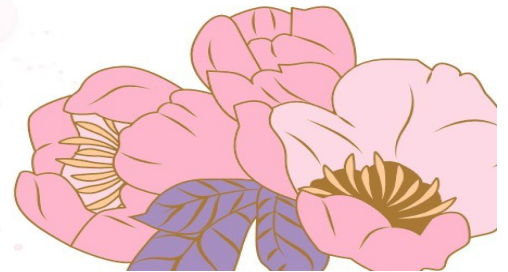
