Will You Notice the Shoot?

Today's first reading from the prophet Isaiah offers a familiar Advent image: the shoot sprouting from the stump of Jesse. The verses immediately preceding speak of God walking through the forest with an ax: "The tall of stature shall be felled, and the lofty ones shall be brought low" (Isaiah 10:33). But now, amidst all the destruction, a tiny sign of new life emerges, and the Spirit of God descends upon it, bearing many gifts—wisdom, understanding, counsel, strength, knowledge, awe, delight.

So often, when we scroll through the news, our attention is captured by violence and war and the "mighty" who make great noise when they fall. "Even now the ax lies at the root of the trees," echoes John the Baptist in today's gospel. If we are looking for where God's Spirit can be found, however, Isaiah reminds us we will need to look elsewhere. We will need to attend to the quiet, fragile resurrections taking place below the surface when it appears as if all has been lost. If we seek wisdom, understanding, counsel, strength, knowledge, awe, and delight, we will need to look where the little ones of the earth are found. We must have our eyes open for the shoots.

The gospels emphasize that Jesus was one such little one. Although the glory days of his people seemed to have come to a crashing close, they have not. In him, we glimpse the truth that life is stronger than death. We see that the future has not been erased, no matter how terrible the past. In him, we find our hope. ●

FOOD & CLOTHING DRIVE

The Knights of Columbus is again initiating a Food/Clothing Drive during the Christmas season.

Things have changed. The Marian Centre has changed its operations and is no longer providing noon meals and are providing breakfast only. To assist them with breakfast they require Cheese Whiz, jams of any flavor, and peanut butter.

They also provide items on an individual basis such as canned fruit, soup, deodorant, small body wash and razors. In addition they are providing limited emergency clothing such as winter coats, gloves and socks for men, women and children.

Visitation House is currently closed while they are going through a restructuring. Non-perishable goods will be collected as in the past but will be given to Souls Harbour who provide hot meals at noon. Their need is great as they serve 200+ meals per day.

Collection Bins will be at both church entrances from Nov. 29 through Dec 14. Your assistance will be greatly appreciated.

K of C CAROL FESTIVAL SUCCESS



PRO-LIFE NEWS

Fertility Rate Drops to Record Low in Canada

Canada's fertility rate had reached a record low of 1.25 children per woman last year, according to new data from Statistics Canada. Canada's fertility rate has generally been declining for decades, down from the peak of almost four (3.94) children per woman in 1959, according to a 2024 StatCan report.

One of the sharpest declines in fertility rate occurred in the mid 1960s and early 1970s following introduction of the hormonal birth control pill in 1960, at the time used to regulate menstrual cycles. Then decriminalization of the pill as a form of contraception followed in 1969 along with decriminalization of abortion the same year.

The fertility rates dropped below the "cohort replacement level" of 2.1 children per woman for the first time in 1972, meaning the birth rate is no longer high enough to naturally replace the population. Now the stat is down to 1.25.

AN ADVENT STORY

From a Dec. 3, 1991 episode of Mother Angelica LIVE on EWTN about Advent:

During the broadcast she asked the studio audience, "Advent is a time of penance. Did you know that?" She went on to explain that Advent is a time of preparation for Christmas, and not only for decorating the tree and buying gifts.

She said, "God doesn't want your pocketbook. He wants your heart. He wants your mind. He wants you to be filled with him. He doesn't want all these kinds of sacrifices that you just drop in front of Him and then go your way, living a sinful life. ..."

"I'm all for trees and decorations, but not at the expense of a lack of repentance in my heart, a lack of real repentance that says, "Lord, I haven't given You an ounce of my time ..."

Phone calls that followed focused on the theme of offering up our repentance, faults, and struggles to Jesus in preparation for his birth on Christmas.

As the Mother Angelica LIVE episode came to a close, Mother shared a special Advent tradition they partake in at the monastery.

"In our monastery, we have a little custom. We put an empty crib out and then we have a little pan of straw, bag of straw. And do something for the Lord that's really hard or what we call virtue-like...We go pick a straw and we put it in the crib. And I say to the sisters, 'Now I hope this crib is full of straw for Christmas Eve!'"

THE ADVENT CANDLES

Advent wreaths are usually made of leaves and feature four candles, each symbolizing one of the four weeks. Three of these candles are purple and one is pink.

Purple candles signify prayer, penance, and preparation for Christ's coming. In the past, Advent was called a "little Lent," which explains the color purple, associated with repentance.

As Lent prepares Christians for Christ's resurrection at Easter, Advent serves as a time of preparation for both Christ's birth at Christmas and, in the first two weeks, reflects on His future coming.

The pink candle is lit on the Third Sunday of Advent, or "Gaudete Sunday". On this day, the priest wears pink vestments during Mass. Gaudete Sunday is a celebration of joy, as it marks the halfway point of Advent and brings the faithful closer to the anticipation of Christ's birth.

The circular shape of the Advent

wreath represents eternity, symbolizing a state without beginning or end. This reflects the eternal nature of God, who exists outside of time.

The wreath's green color represents hope and vitality. It reflects Christ's presence and calls us to nurture a life of grace and spiritual growth.

STEWARSHIP BULLETIN BITS

"Therefore, stay awake! For you do not know on which day your Lord will come." MATTHEW 24:42

People who have had health issues or near-death experiences generally have a greater appreciation for each day being a gift from God. The rest of us usually take for granted that we will be around tomorrow. But when you start to look at each day as a gift, you realize all the little miracles that happen daily and you begin to see God's active presence in your life. You grow in gratitude, each day, for all that we have been given.

Thinking Faith S03 : E08/E12

Angels, Demons, Purgatory, and do we all worship the same God?

In this episode of Thinking Faith, Deacon Eric and Dr. Brett Salkeld respond to questions from grade 9 and 10 students at Miller Catholic High School. They dive into topics such as the nature of purgatory, offering metaphors and practical examples to help understand the process of purification. They explain how angels, including fallen angels, fit into Christian theology, touching on the distinctions between angels and humans. Finally, they tackle the question of whether Muslims, Christians, and Catholics serve the same God, **exploring the nuances** and commonalities in beliefs about God across these faiths.
